Five ready-to-use spreadsheets for your Cricut journey

Thank you for picking up **Cricut for Beginners**! To help your projects go smoothly, I've put together five spreadsheets that take care of the fiddly parts — the looking-up, the keeping-track, and the math. Open whichever one you need, when you need it. Every file has one example row already filled in so you can see how it works, then just type over it and make it yours.

1 **Project Cost & Pricing Calculator** **START HERE IF YOU'LL SELL**

Punch in your materials and time, and it tells you what to charge — and what you'll actually pocket after fees. No more guessing (or undercharging).

2 **Material Settings Cheat Sheet** *2_Material_Settings_Cheat_Sheet.xlsx*

The answer to "which setting do I use?" — 14 common materials matched to the right Design Space setting, blade, and mat, with a tip for each.

3 **Vinyl & Material Inventory Tracker** *3_Vinyl_and_Material_Inventory_Tracker.xlsx*

Log what's in your craft drawer so you stop re-buying colors you already own. It even flags what's running low all on its own.

4 **Project Planner & Log** *4_Project_Planner_and_Log.xlsx*

Jot down every project as you go — what you made, what you used, how it turned out. Over time it becomes a little portfolio of your work.

5 **Iron-On Time & Temperature Guide** *5_Iron-On_Time_and_Temperature_Guide.xlsx*

Temp, press time, and warm-or-cold peel for 8 kinds of iron-on — plus the three rules beginners always forget (mirror, pre-press, peel).

How to open these: each file ends in **.xlsx** — it opens in Microsoft Excel, or free in Google Sheets (upload it to your Google Drive) or LibreOffice Calc. Type only in the shaded cells; the rest does the figuring for you. Nothing to install, nothing to sign up for.

The settings, temperatures, and prices in these files are friendly starting points, not hard rules — always run a test cut on a scrap and confirm heat settings against Cricut's official guide for your exact material and machine.
